Arrive Alive

According to the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health, workers are more likely to die from traffic-related motor vehicle crashes than from any other hazards on the job.



Stay Alert and Drive Defensively- be cautious, aware, and responsible at all times.

Never Rush- Allow extra time to get to your destination point.

Obey Posted Speed Limits and maintain a safe distances between vehicles. During inclement weather or low visibility reduce your speed.

Use Your Turn Signals and provide plenty of warning for other drivers if you plan to turn or change lanes.

Be Extra Cautious at Intersections- don't rush traffic lights, come to a complete stop at Stop signs- make sure you have a clear and safe right-of-way.



Wear Your Seatbelt at All Times.

Never Mix Drinking Alcohol and Driving.

Avoid Talking on Your Cell-Phone.
