
Bloodborne Pathogens

- 1)** What are the hazards involved with bloodborne pathogens?
 - a. Infectious diseases

- 2)** What hazards should be recognized?
 - a. Blood
 - b. Bodily fluids
 - c. Sewage

- 3)** What safe practices should be used?
 - a. Treat all blood and body fluids as if they were hazardous
 - b. Use PPE (latex gloves, gowns, masks, etc.)
 - c. Bandage cuts, scrapes, and broken skin
 - d. Discard sharp objects in proper containers
 - e. Wash your hands every time you exit the bathroom
 - f. Wash hands and any other areas that contact blood or other body fluids
 - g. Limit access and disinfect equipment, tools, and flooring that has come in contact with blood or other body fluids
 - h. Never recap or share needles

- 6)** Do we have containers for disposing sharp objects?
- 7)** Where is our first aid kit?
- 8)** Why should we never eat, smoke, or dip snuff in a bathroom?
